Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On Thursday nights through the early part of November a group of 8-10 of us are meeting for a book study on C.S. Lewis's book "Mere Christianity". C.S. Lewis was a great 20th century defender and spreader of the faith. Having been an atheist, he is especially attuned to the "skeptical" audience when it comes to religion in general and Christianity in particular. Below are a few quotes from this book that I have found especially helpful. Enjoy!

"I am trying here to prevent anyone saying the really foolish thing that people often say about Him: I'm ready to accept Jesus as a great moral teacher, but I don't accept his claim to be God. That is the one thing we must not say. A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic — on the level with the man who says he is a poached egg — or else He would be the Devil of Hell. You must make your choice. Either this man was, and is, the Son of God, or else a madman or something worse. You can shut Him up for a fool, you can spit at Him and kill Him as a demon or you can fall at His feet and call him Lord and God, but let us not come with any patronizing nonsense about His being a great human teacher. He has not left that open to us. He did not intend to."

"A proud man is always looking down on things and people; and, of course, as long as you are looking down, you cannot see something that is above you."

"A silly idea is current that good people do not know what temptation means. This is an obvious lie. Only those who try to resist temptation know how strong it is... A man who gives in to temptation after five minutes simply does not know what it would have been like an hour later. That is why bad people, in one sense, know very little about badness. They have lived a sheltered life by always giving in."

"Do not waste time bothering whether you 'love' your neighbor; act as if you did. As soon as we do this we find one of the great secrets. When you are behaving as if you loved someone, you will presently come to love him."

This month’s OOPS comes from Ruth Nelson, who will head up the Grief Ministry Plan she recently proposed to our BOCO (Board of Christian Outreach) Noting that the feeling of loss weighs heavily on the hearts of those who have lost loved ones long after the funeral is over and the sympathy calls and cards have stopped coming, she plans to reach out to the newly bereaved in our church family in the following way:

- (1) A caring phone call several weeks after the funeral,
- (2) a request for a short home visit opportunity to bring them a special gift from St. Paul’s, and
- (3) the gift of a sympathy card from The Arbor Day Foundation announcing that a tree will be planted by them in honor of the loved one of the bereaved.

Continuing to reach out in Christian love to those in our church family and friendship circles who have lost loved ones is not just a good suggestion. It’s what the love of Jesus often calls us who love Jesus to do.

Youth Night



ASK THE PASTOR

QUESTIONS · ANSWERS · TRUTH

Question: What about cremation?

This is one of the most common questions that has come my way in my 27 years of ministry. While the practice is not inherently sinful, and not forbidden by the Lord, believers for centuries have used the burial of the body as an opportunity to express their Christian faith. God does not just care about our soul; He also cares for our body. Why? He created it, and through Jesus Christ He will one day resurrect it. On a very practical level it is very helpful to have a place where one can go to remember that this person existed. Scatterings one's ashes does not allow this to happen. A cross or Bible verse placed on the gravestone can provide a witness even in one's death of Christ's victory over death and everything that surrounds it. Again, Christ will resurrect the believer, whether cremated or not. However, for 95% of Christian history, the care and burial of the body gave the believer one last chance to declare that Jesus' love for body and soul, does not end when we breath our last and our hearts stop beating. A recent study on this topic from the Lutheran Church in Canada makes the following point...

From the time of the Patriarchs onward, God's people treated the human body with great dignity after death and conscientiously and faithfully established and maintained tombs for the dead. Conversely, being burned up with fire is most often associated scripturally with the judgement of God. Throughout her history, the Christian Church has not sanctioned or encouraged the practice of intentionally destroying the body after death. Following the Jewish burial practices, the human body has been consistently and reverently entombed; its return to dust has been left in the hands of the One who created it. (Cremation and the Christian, a 2011 report by the Lutheran Church of Canada)
