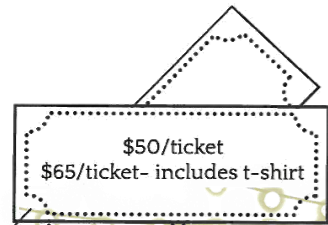
Adult Sunday morning Bible Study (9:15-10:15am)
