Justification

"For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith..." Romans 3:23-25a

Dear friends and members of St. Paul's,

On October 31st we celebrate(d) the "Festival of the Reformation." The Reformation, in the 16th century, can be seen in several ways.

- -Some see it as a "David (Martin Luther) vs. Goliath (The Roman Catholic Church) story, with David coming out victorious.
- -Others see the Reformation as a time when the laity finally gained the ability to read the Bible in their own language (Luther translated the Bible into the German language).
- -Still others view it as a time when the message of God's love became much greater than God's judgment.

These are important views, with some truth attached to each one. However, the ultimate message of the Reformation was not whether God is merciful and loving—most people knew that, rather, it was "Can God's love in Christ really be funneled into my life?" Put another way, "How does a sinful creature obtain a right standing before God?" Too often the answer given, both then and now, involved some sort of human performance.

In the Bible, to be justified means that through Christ Jesus, our Lord acts as a gracious judge in pronouncing the fallen sinner innocent. This may surprise us, because, in our view, just served means we get what our sins deserve. Isn't Justification all about receiving mercy instead of justice? Romans 6:4 states "We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life." If the payment for sin is death, then that payment must be served.

My fellow believers, Jesus took us into the tomb with him. This means we have "done the time" that our sins deserve. In our baptism we were both buried and raised with Christ. We not only did the time, but we have been freed! Dr. Robert Kolb wrote in his book <u>The Christian Faith</u>, "Sinners do die, God does justice to them in justification. He buries them. He buries them with Christ. Christ has taken the sins of the world and hides them in his tomb, the only place in his universe where the Father's glance never falls." (Kolb, 161).

How joyous to know that our connection to God is not based or maintained by human performance, but rather on the Savior who has "covered all the bases" when it comes to connecting you to himself. Enjoy the freedom that He brings!

The Lutheran/Christian Difference: The Small Catechism



Luther's Small Catechism was originally written in the 16th century as a response to the minimal understanding of key Christian teachings among laity and pastors. The small catechism was not meant to replace God's Word or even stand beside God's Word. Rather, it was written to bring out in an orderly way the central teachings of the Christian faith as expressed in the Bible. The small catechism clarifies what we are called to do through the Ten Commandments. What we are to believe via the creed. How we are to pray in the Lord's Prayer. How we are to live as saints and sinners in a lifetime of confession and absolution.

Finally, the catechism reveals how the Lord's Supper and Baptism bring the blessings of Jesus' death and resurrection tangibly into our lives. The catechism was intended to be more of a prayer book than a textbook, in that a believer was expected to meditate on it throughout his or her life. The explanation to the catechism is also helpful as it gives an astounding number of Biblical references to various Christian teachings, and it addresses many issues of our day. Go ahead and "dust off" that catechism or better yet purchase a new one. The latest addition came out in 2018 and can be purchased at Concordia Publishing House by calling 1-800-325-3040.

TRUSTEES REPORT October 26, 2021 - VOTERS MEETING

-The table & chair project is complete. Tables & chairs were purchased from Sam's Club after a small committee visited local churches for ideas. 140 chairs, 20 rectangle tables and 8 round tables were purchased along with three new storage racks. Final cost was \$ 5750.

-The bell tower needs repair. Contractors are being contacted.

-The shrubs & trees on the church property have been trimmed or removed. Landscaping will be performed next spring. At least 3 of the trees were dead or dying.

-Water damage to the Old Narthex is being repaired.

-Trustees approved the Daisy Troop led by Erin Smoll use of the Fellowship Hall at 6:30 on the 2nd & 4th Thursday. -The sale of the historic church & school property to Gregg Crawford is scheduled to close on Oct 22. The

- Trustees hired Attorney Tim Gutnicht to review the sale documents and provide advice on the sale. All donated items have been removed & returned to the owners. Only a few large items remain in the church. An organ, a piano & several other items will be moved to storage. Contact Helen if interested.
- -Trustees have been cleaning gutters, repairing base boards, cleaning return air grilles, repairing loose facia and other maintenance issues.
- -Doors of the church have been painted by Volunteers.
- -The Preschool/Food Pantry Restrooms was completed in August for a cost of \$9800 thanks to numerous volunteers. Stop by and take a look.
- -A new computer program (Church 360) was purchased to replace a record keeping program that was 20-years-old. Much easier to use.

 A painting party is being planned for next spring. Many areas will be painted. Volunteers will be needed.
Worn entrance mats are being replaced and the floors of the Narthex and Fellowship Hall are scheduled to be cleaned by a contractor. Our Rally Day Theme was Jesus, our Good Shepherd. We learned how we are like sheep and how Jesus is our Good Shepherd who takes care of us. We practiced being shepherds with balloon sheep and learned how difficult it can be to shepherd sheep. We had fun making sheep out of marshmallows and pretzels.


