Some years back I heard an individual express appreciation for Alcoholics Anonymous because it was an organization that called him to live honestly. Biblically speaking, to live honestly before God

happens through repentance. Repentance is more than remorse over some action. For example, Judas Iscariot was distraught at betraying Jesus, but he was not repentant. While sometimes repentance in the Bible is shorthand for faith, usually repentance involves both recognizing our sin and at the same time trusting/turning to Jesus who lives to cleanse our sin. It is that second part of repentance, trust and turning to Jesus, that makes repentance a sacred gift. A blessed Lententide to all.





Blessings and peace from our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen. We had a very encouraging meeting this week with Dale's doctor. While he does have multiple myeloma, Dale's case is very slight, what they describe as smoldering. Some people have this for many years. And for this level, no treatment is needed; rather, they will monitor him for certain levels within his blood. He still needs to have a skeletal scan to make sure he has not lesions on the bones (one of the side effects of the disease). And the doctor wants to see him in three months. Please, pray that this level of the disease will hold. And pray that we might be able to establish a working relationship between the doctor here and the doctor in the Czech Republic. Your prayers are greatly appreciated.
