
anytime. I'm sure you will find that many of our topics and service activities will help equip you in your faith life. If you need more information, call Wanda at 618-281-4691.

April 10th and 11th (Passion Sunday) "A King without the Extra's" John 12:12-19.



church grounds by the playground.


Easter Sunrise Service:


The Sunday School Corner:

An Easter OOPS – Send a Card

Today, we often employ texts and emails with cute emogies and amazing graphics to communicate our sentiments to our family and friends at both happy and sad times in their lives. Almost gone are the days when a friend or loved one will take out a piece of stationary and write a kind note or make a special trip to the store to buy a greeting card to let us know we are on their mind and in their heart. In fact, so rarely are personal notes and greeting cards sent today, that when one does arrive in our mailboxes, it really tickles us.

Keeping that in mind, this month's Outreach Opportunity Suggestion from your Board of Christian Outreach is: Go to the nearest card store and buy a box or maybe a half dozen Easter cards and send one to a friend, a neighbor, or a family member who has suffered the loss of a loved one since last Easter.
