

Sam Wegner, our summer DCE
intern in 2021 will be here as a
year long intern starting in June of
this year. We are excited to have
Sam among us, and we pray that
it will a good experience for all
involved. Please keep her in your



prayers as she transitions following her graduation in May to life here at St. Paul's.

How did having a DCE Intern come about?

We recently completed the congregational Re:Vitality (Future planning) program, and toward the end of that process it became evident that an intentional and consistent ministry to youth and young adults was a congregational need. In the recent past, volunteers have dedicated a good deal of time and energy to this work. They did a great job, but there is only so much a lay volunteer can give to this very important work. Rather than call a full time DCE or Deaconess, it was felt that an intern might be a good way to "try out" this type of ministry.

What will Sam be doing?

Sam will work with the youth committee and the Board of Elders to help implement a program for middle school and high school youth. Secondarily she will work with young adults ages 18-35. Depending on her time, Sam may also lead regular Bible Studies, help organize service projects, work with the board of outreach, and be part of the various women's ministries in the congregation.

What is the cost to the congregation?

The January Voter's meeting approved a total coast of 31,000 with 40% of the funds coming from the general budget and 60% from the recent Schneider Endowment fund. This cost includes and 1,100 dollar a month stipend along with providing an apartment and utilities.

Where will Sam be living?

The present plan is to get Sam an apartment in the Columbia area.

Hello Fellow St. Paul Members,

My name is Amanda Douglas. My husband and 7 children are newer members of St. Paul and usually attend the 10:30am service. I have been communicating with Pastor Krenz for the last few months about a ministry that I have been thinking and praying about for the last several years. The ministry idea is an LCMS residential facility for women struggling with life controlling issues (such as depression, anxiety, self-harm, eating disorders, and drug addiction) that would be called A.C.C.T. Ministries (Answering Christ's Call Today). I believe there is a huge need for facilities where women can live, work, and get back on their feet. There is an even bigger need for these types of sanctuaries for women, that also give them the hope of the true Gospel that is found in Christ Jesus. A place that would provide a temporary home that allows these individuals to not only thrive physically, but spiritually as well. There are very little LCMS programs of this kind in the country. I would love for St. Paul to help spearhead this ministry. Over the next year others will be contacted on the District and Synodical level to see if something like this can get off the ground. If filling this kind of need is of interest to anyone in

OOPS for May 2022 — Outreach Opportunity Praying Suggestion

OOPS – Be a Canvasser for the Day Our next Community Canvass is slated for Pentecost Day, June 5, 2022—what I great Lord's Day for an outreaching event, don't you think?

Canvassers will meet a church at 2 p.m. for instructions, be paired up, canvass their designated area for about an hour, return to church for sharing and refreshments, and be on their way by 4:30 p.m.

Canvassers will leave door hangers when no one is home and offer refrigerator magnets to residents willing to answer several simple survey questions.

At our first canvass last November, our canvassers reached 110 homes, made

37 (none negative) personal contacts.

Somewhat surprisingly, all 13 canvassers were connected to either our Board of Christian Outreach or Board of Elders.

Although several did sign up, not a single member of the congregation-at-large responded to the call for canvassers.

Hopefully, a few more of you will sign up this time to be a Canvasser-for-the-Day so we can tell even more souls in our Columbia community our St. Paul's Lutheran church family cares about them and would love to serve them in the Name of Jesus in any way we can-which is what the message on our door hanger says.
