
Brothers and Sisters in Christ,




Transformed by Jesus

ASK THE PASTOR

Question: Can a person lose their salvation?

There are several Scripture passages that speak of those who had faith, and who fell from that faith (John 6:66, 1 Timothy 1:19). There are also warnings in the Bible to not fall away (1 Corinthians 10:12, Hebrews 2:1-3). These verses assume that people had faith at one time. How can you fall away from something if you did not have in the first place? Thank goodness the Word of God calls even believers to live a life of repentance. Why? So that we do not base our salvation on a false security that comes not from the grace of God but rather on our works/ self-righteousness. Unbelievers tend not to be concerned about the salvation question, so the very fact one is worried about such things is probably a reminder that the Holy Spirit is at work keeping the concerned person in the faith. To those that think they have crossed the unbelief line, I would simply have them look at Peter who denied his Lord, but through God given repentance was brought into the fold again. In addition we can look to the cross and ask "What sin did Jesus not atone for on calvary?" The answer, of course, is that all sin was covered on Calvary. It is also good for those who are unsure to take to heart Bible passages like John 10:27-29, Romans 8, Hebrews 13:5-6, and Luke 15. Can one lose salvation? Yes. However, God will work tirelessly throughout our earthly life to bring and keep us in the faith.
