### Frequently asked Questions

(The answer to the below question was taken from the LCMS Web site)



## Why do we practice Close Communion?

This is one of the most common questions I have received through the years. To some it seems unfriendly to invite friends or relatives of other church backgrounds to worship and then not offer them the Lord's Supper. After all, isn't this meal a gift for all?

It has been a long-standing practice of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod that individuals have some understanding of the Lord's Supper, who Jesus is, and what it means to "examine oneself" before communion is offered. Often this understanding takes place at confirmation or some sort of instruction before receiving the Lord's Supper. Why do we do this?

The New Testament makes it very clear that we are encountering the actual body and blood of the Lord which bestows forgiveness and strength for living. According to 1 Corinthians 11:29 to take the Lord's Supper without "discerning the body and blood of Christ", is at best problematic.

In addition, we are called to "examine ourselves" before taking the meal (1 Corinthians 11:28). Prior instruction helps one learn what "examining oneself" means. This meal is also a meal where the Christian community joyfully confesses the same things on Christ, sin, baptism, grace, the law; and in short, the Biblical teachings as summed up in the small catechism.

While we rejoice in the common beliefs we have with all Christians, there are some teachings within various denominations that are at odds with Scripture. Some might be surprised to know that most churches in Christendom practice some form of close communion. These churches include our brothers and sisters in the Roman Catholic Church, Eastern Orthodox churches, and even some Protestants congregations. Some Presbyterians call it "Fencing the table."

I confess that we/I have at times been unloving in this practice, and even given the impression that our fellow believers are somehow less in the kingdom of God. Repentance is the only response to that attitude and approach. However, when practiced carefully and correctly, close communion allows us to care for our fellow believers.

One final point, The worship service is filled with the Word of God, which the Holy Spirit uses to create and sustain faith. Whether coming to the table or not, that proclaimed, read, and sung Word is used by God to bless all those who have opportunity to hear it.
