Members and friends of St. Paul's

While the sermon and the Lord's Supper are key components of weekly worship,

"They devoted themselves to the apostles teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers" Acts 2:42

they only cover about half of the service. What is the point of the other half?

Virtually all aspects of the "other half" of worship are either direct quotes of Scripture, or closely related. Scriptural prayers of praise, confession, and lament are spoken responsively or sung in hymns. Romans 10:17 says that "Faith comes by hearing and hearing through the Word of Christ." That Word of Christ can be found in the three Scripture readings, which are read on a three-year cycle. The other half of the service also shows us God's expectations and it

continually assures us of our salvation in Christ. We start out confessing our sin, and after hearing absolution we joyfully move forward, ready to hear the Word of God from three readings. After hearing these readings, we joyfully proclaim to God and others who He is in the Nicene or Apostles Creed. After, the sermon specific prayers are brought to the Divine throne, and we then move joyfully to receiving our Savior's very body and blood. After receiving this great gift, we soon depart hearing God's blessings in the Benediction.

Some years back an elderly lady came up to me and said that she heard little of the service, including my sermon, but nonetheless she came to receive God's blessing. This was a lady who knew, and treasured the other half of the service. Lord, help us do the same!





Cohabitation, what is the big deal?

Many of you reading this newsletter remember a time when living together prior to being married was called "living in sin". My how times have changed.

According to the pew research center 69% of Americans find cohabitation acceptable even if couples never get married. For those who are under the age of thirty this percentage increases to 78%. How are we to respond?

First, let us raise up the goodness and blessing of marriage. God created it (Genesis 2:24), and throughout the Bible He shows that sexual intimacy between couples is reserved for this relationship alone (Matthew 19:6,1 Corinthians 6:9-10, Ephesians 5:3). Marriage is also the go to image of Christ's relationship to the church (Ephesians 5:25-27).

Second, the notion that "pretending to be married" gives a good insight to actual marriage is simply not the case Biblically, nor is it the case psychologically. Studies vary, but most that I have seen still say that divorce is a more likely outcome for couples who cohabitate, versus those who do not cohabitate (Psychology Today Post, January 27th, 2021).

Third, there are legal protections that marriage provides that cohabitating couples do not participate in. These include property and inheritance rights and medical rights should there be a serious medical difficulty.

Fourth, to refrain from cohabitation prior to marriage stands out in our culture, and that gives Christian couples and family members a chance to share why this honors Christ, and in the long run is best for their relationship. Next month, some approaches family members and friends might consider when addressing this issue with those who are presently cohabitating or considering it.
