Pastoral Ponderings- Why Give?

Some years back I was listening to KFUO-850 radio and the guest said something about giving which I found quite insightful. "Even if all the congregations in Christendom had their financial and volunteer needs met, the giving

of time, talent, and treasure should still be part of the Christians life. The Christian's calling is not merely to give in response to a <u>need</u>, but rather to give because of a <u>relationship</u> with his heavenly Father."

Put another way, God doesn't need our gifts, but we need to give. Might it be that we are reluctant givers because we think we are giving away something that is ours to give? Christian giving is not needs based, rather it is relationship based. In this relationship Christ Jesus gives us more than He demands from us. Even if it were possible to give 100% of all we had, it would be a mere drop in the ocean compared to what we have received from our gracious God.
