happens on my terms and not on Your terms." It is certainly good for us to receive God's Word and speak to God outside of public worship through personal devotions, prayer, and group Bible studies. Yet, most of us are not disciplined and focused enough to spend an hour plus hearing God's Word, praying, singing, and reflecting on the God who is so good to us. In addition, if we continually miss worship, we also miss out on the blessings of the Lord's Supper. May the Lord help each of us hold his word sacred, and gladly hear and learn it!

Sally called her daughter to let her know a company had just installed an alarm system on her house. It was complete with motion sensors, door sensors, window sensors, a panic button, and even glass breakage sound sensors. Sally remarked, "After the rash of break-ins in the neighborhood lately, I Installed this to give me peace of mind. But now that I have all these protections in place, I almost feel captive in my home, not feeling safe to go outside anymore."

Sally's experience is what happens when we focus our lives merely on "protecting what is ours." God has not given us blessings to store them, but to use them. With his blessings, we bless our families, and we bless ministries so that the life of Jesus is shared in our communities and world. While there is no harm in taking precautions in an often dangerous world, our hope is not found in those precautions. We never want those precautions to take the place of active blessings.

That same thing is true about putting together our Christian Estate Plans. 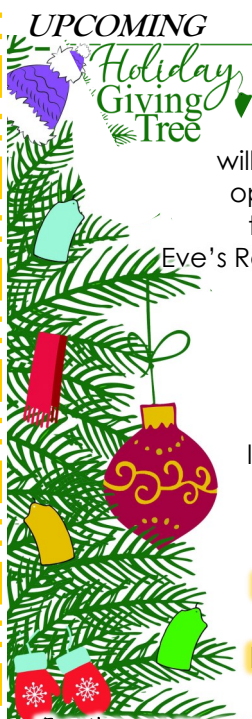

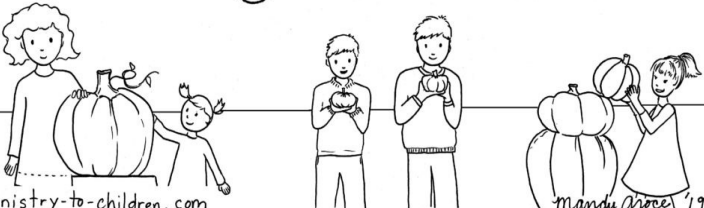

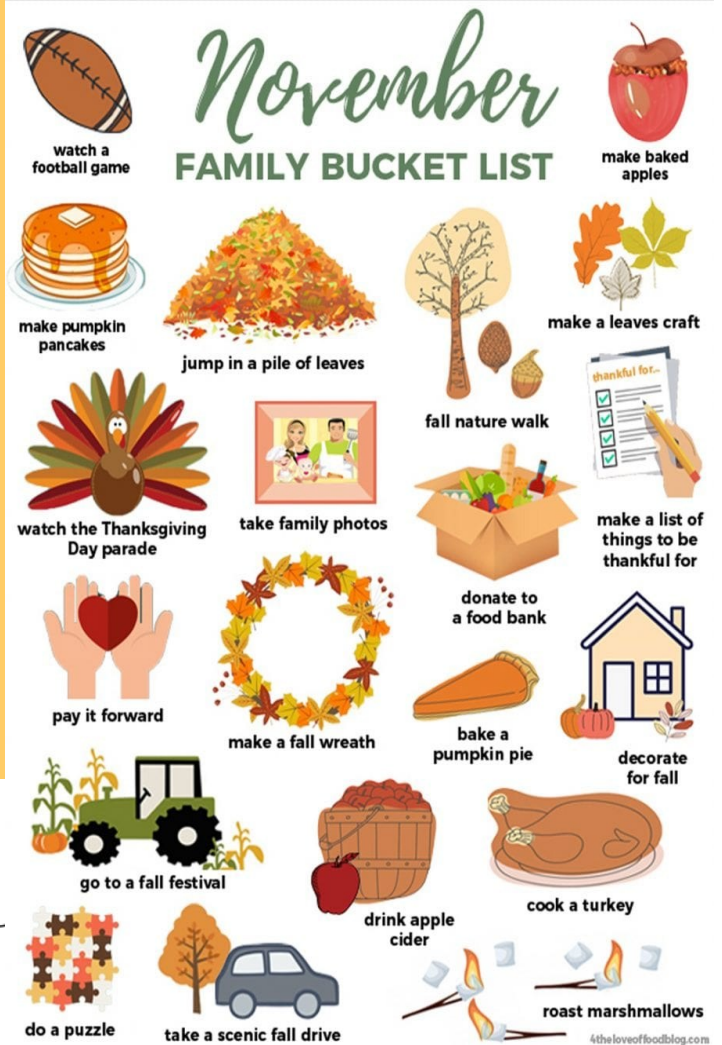




OOPS - It's Your Turn?

Church Considers Cell Tower Proposal To Support Community Connectivity

Our church leadership is currently reviewing a proposal to install a cell phone tower on church property. This opportunity has come through discussions with a telecommunications provider seeking to improve network coverage in our area.

Why This Matters

Improved cell coverage would benefit not only churchgoers but also the broader community by enhancing signal strength, call reliability, and data access in surrounding neighborhoods. Many rural and suburban areas still face gaps in reliable service, and this installation could play a part in closing that digital divide.

Stewardship and Support

Beyond improved connectivity, the lease agreement for the tower would generate steady income for the church of \$700 per month with an inflation rider would be included in any agreement. These funds could help support ministries, outreach programs, building maintenance, or other mission-related activities—further enabling us to serve our congregation and neighbors.

Next Steps

The church council is carefully evaluating the proposal and would plan to bring this to a congregational vote, taking into account technical, legal, aesthetic, and environmental considerations. We are also committed to transparency and welcome questions or concerns from our congregation and community.

Friends and Members of St. Paul's,

It will come as a shock to no one that we are living in a strange and difficult political environment. Our government has been shut down, and our country seems to be more divided than ever. As people claimed by Christ and part of his church, I would encourage you to avoid two extremes. The first is total disengagement. We are called to love our neighbors in all areas of life, including at home, school, work, church, and community. It is tempting only to see our neighbor in a few of the above places and forget about the rest. While it is true that doing what is best for our neighbor in our community, our country, our state, and our county seems so ineffective compared to doing what is best for them at home, in our church, at school, and at work. The truth is, God has placed us in this county, state, country, and world to do what is best for our distant neighbor. With that in mind it is good to pray for our civic leaders and contact those in the government with our views on how best to serve our neighbor. In other words, be engaged.

The second extreme to avoid is to think this political party, government or other various earthly kingdoms are the be all and end all. The fact is, we are part of the kingdom of heaven, and Jesus through the power of the Spirit is hard at work showing the world his grace, mercy, and peace. He does this by calling the world to repentance and trust in the King of Kings, who alone brings order to our disordered world. He is at work bringing this greater kingdom to bear on the world, and you and I get to be part of it in His church. When you get disillusioned by the shenanigans happening on the political level remember we belong to another kingdom, and often behind the scenes, that kingdom continues to move forward.

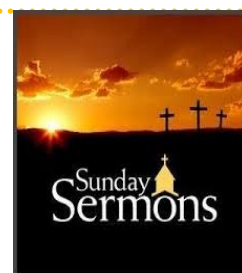
