

## A Very Sad Day in Illinois

Dear friends and Members of St. Paul's,


On Dec. 12, Gov. JB Pritzker signed SB 1950 into law, allowing terminally ill adults who are Illinois residents to end their lives through self-administered lethal drugs prescribed by a physician. Illinois became the eleventh state in the union to allow physicians assisted suicide. While it may sound humane to hasten the death of those who suffer at the end of life, it is in fact more compassionate to care, be present, and do everything outside of death to alleviate the suffering of those who have been given a terminal prognosis. Oswald Byer, a Christian writer, summed up our world's view on such issues and our Christian response to that view with these words. "We live in a world where the weak are often pushed aside and the most fragile among us, the unborn and the aged, are seen as legitimate targets for extermination — the act of killing them even identified as mercy. How different from the Holy Scriptures where mercy, a characteristic of the Triune God Himself, is instead about the donation of life and the doing of that which guards and defends this life without reference to how the quality of that existence might otherwise be evaluated. God shows His mercy to the weak and so the psalmist is bold to pray, "Do not cast me off in the time of old age; forsake me not when my strength is spent" (Ps. 71:9).

What are some of the additional problems with the recent law signed in Illinois? It changes the relationship between doctor and patient from supporting life to taking life (The Hypocritic Oath). People will now have the added "legal" pressure to end their lives if they feel it is a burden to others. It normalizes taking one's life for some categories of people which is why many disability groups are very concerned. Now that this practice is legalized, it will inevitably be expanded beyond its original intentions. In Canada, at first death had to be 'reasonably foreseeable', this was abandoned in 2021. In Colombia at first the patient had to be 'in the terminal phase', this also was abandoned in 2021. In Oregon assisted suicide is only for terminal illness, but in 2021 this was deemed to include anorexia. Also in Oregon, the residency requirement was abandoned in 2022.
