For years our congregation has supported Life Network in Waterloo and Red Bud Illinois through our mission budget and our

yearly collection of baby bottles filled with coins. Since 1995 Life Network has offered free and confidential services, resources and education related to pregnancy and sexual health. For over thirty years they have empowered thousands of women and families facing unexpected pregnancies by providing accurate and up to date information with a holistic and compassionate approach.

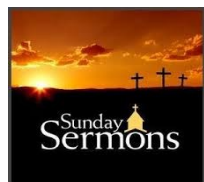
This is a rich blessing in our area, especially considering that there are two nearby clinics, one in Fairview Heights and the other in Granite City, that perform abortions. According to the Guttmacher Institute over 90,000 abortions were performed in Illinois in 2024. This number has doubled since 2017. In 2024, an estimated 42% of pregnancies in Illinois ended in abortion (*This number does not take into account miscarriages*).

While these statistics are sobering, we are blessed that places like Life Network and soon Eve's Restoration Home can provide life affirming places for women and their families who need assistance. While Eve's Restoration Home will not provide pregnancy related services, it will bring Christ centered and holistic assistance to women and their families who too often feel trapped by the lack of helpful life centered choices. I would encourage you to check out Amanda Douglas August article titled "Eve's Restoration"-A Pro-life Mission" that can be found on the Eve's Restoration Web Site. In this post she skillfully explains why this organization is life affirming in a world that so badly needs it.
